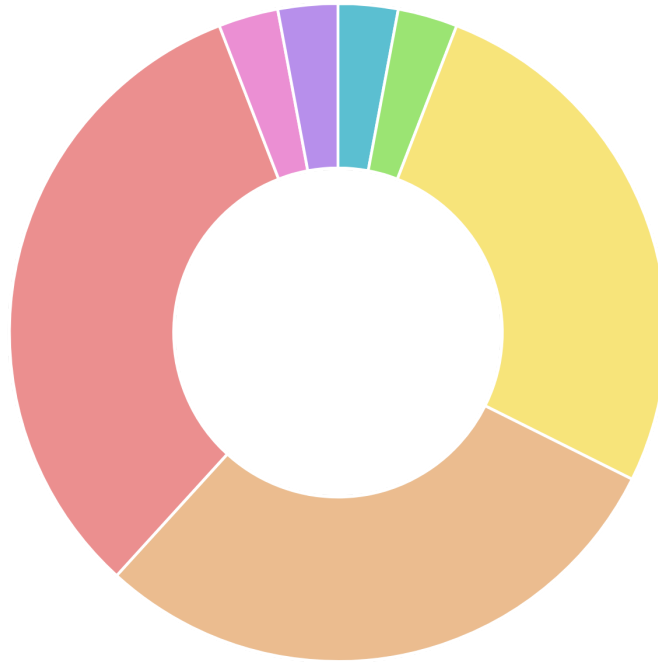

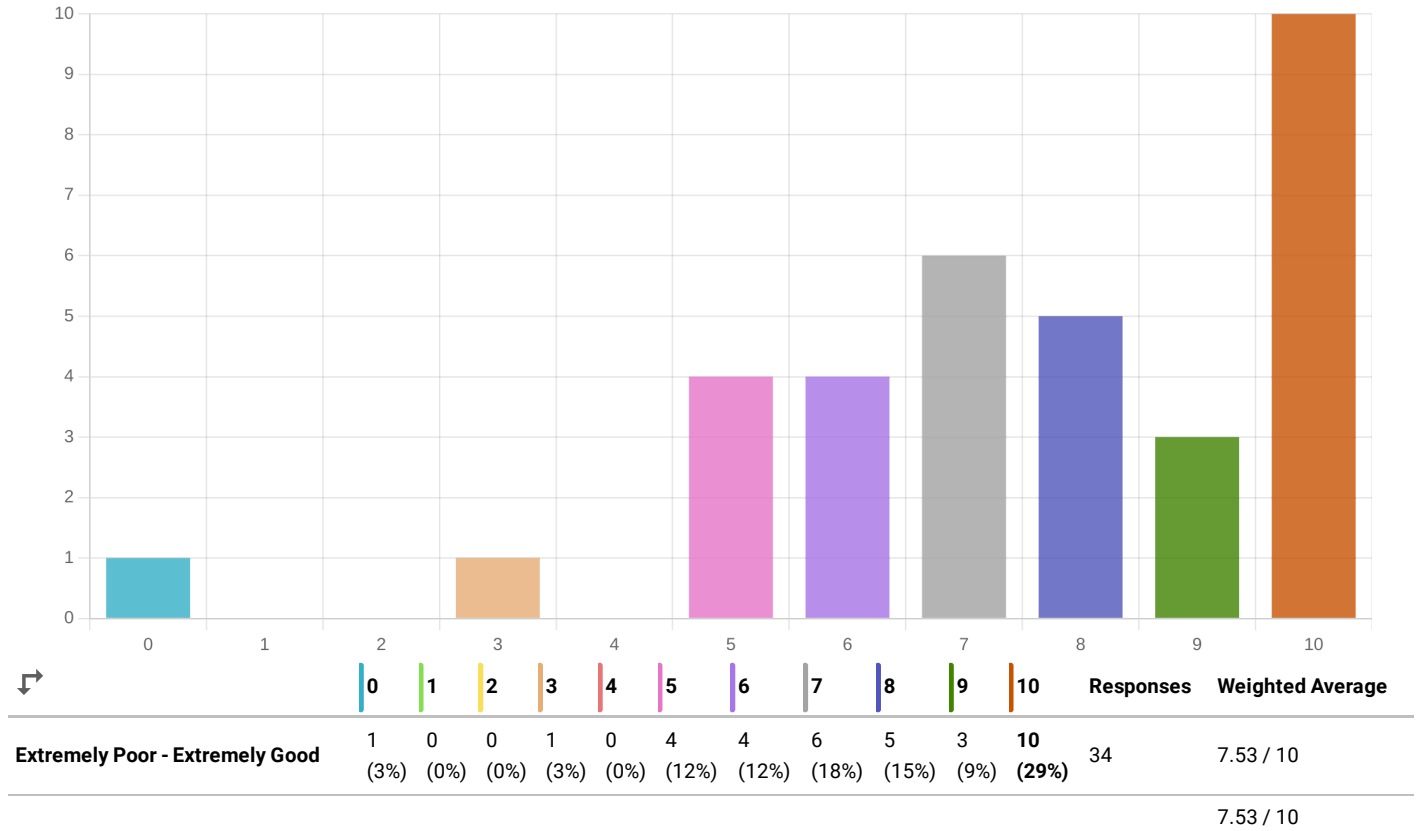

We actively promote boxing locally and partake in competition at provincial and national level. We have 1 official in our club who is active at both provincial and national. We have a representative on our county board and will regularly give input at this level We also partake at the IABA votes and meetings along with our provincial meetings. We take members sparring as much as is possible and are actively in competition

Off grants and bringing young kids of streets

Promoting juvenile and youth boxing in a big way opening up our club to many teams for sparring..

From a purely boxing perspective our club has produced County, Provincial, National Champions, a World Games medalist, International box cup winners and members of National squads.

One of our coaches has refereed at National, European and World Elite Championships over the past 30 years. Previously having been in charge of coaching in all new referee and judges in Galway, he continues to act as Senior Official/Tournament inspector at many of our county championship, league, international and inter-county events.

Another coach is a member of the National coaches pool, coaches a County Senior development squad, acts as secretary & PRO of our county board and is also a member of the Provincial board. The senior coaches in our club have become stalwarts of Galway boxing, upholding the good name and integrity set out in the IABA code of conduct and treating all members, young and old with respect and affording them the attention to pursue the sport and their personal goals.

However, we also strive to represent our sport well outside of the competitive boxing sphere.

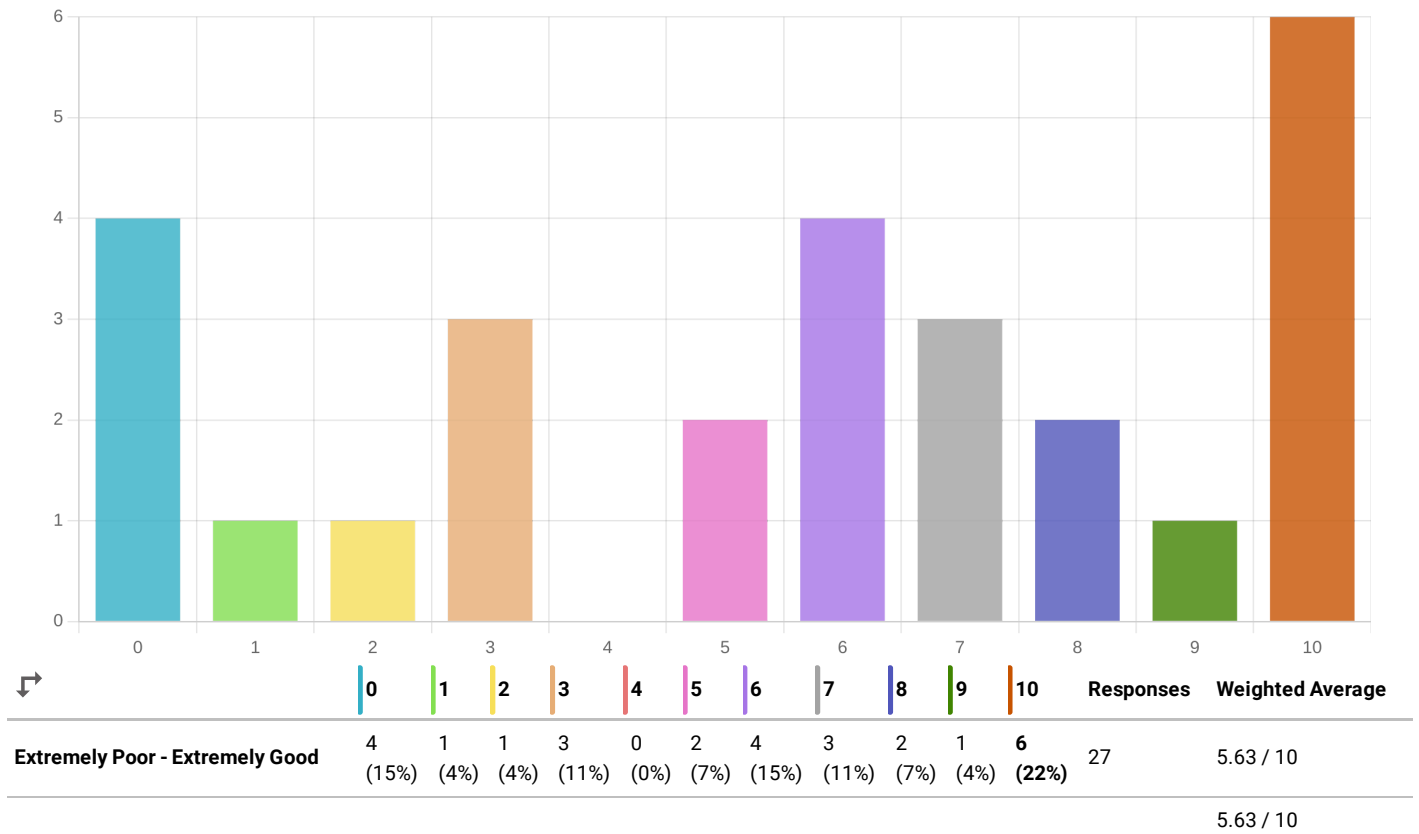
Our club are an active part of our local community. One of the major drivers of our membership each year is our contribution to Active Sports week. We also engage with the local GAA, Athletics and rugby clubs to give children (and past members) the opportunity to try the sport without any commitment to compete or even engage in physical contact. In doing so we hope to minimise any negative connotations associated with boxing.

In recent years our club has also catered to a diverse range of participants. We now have members from over 12 countries and recently have been able to accommodate children with specific needs and difficulties, largely thanks to courses made available by the IABA.

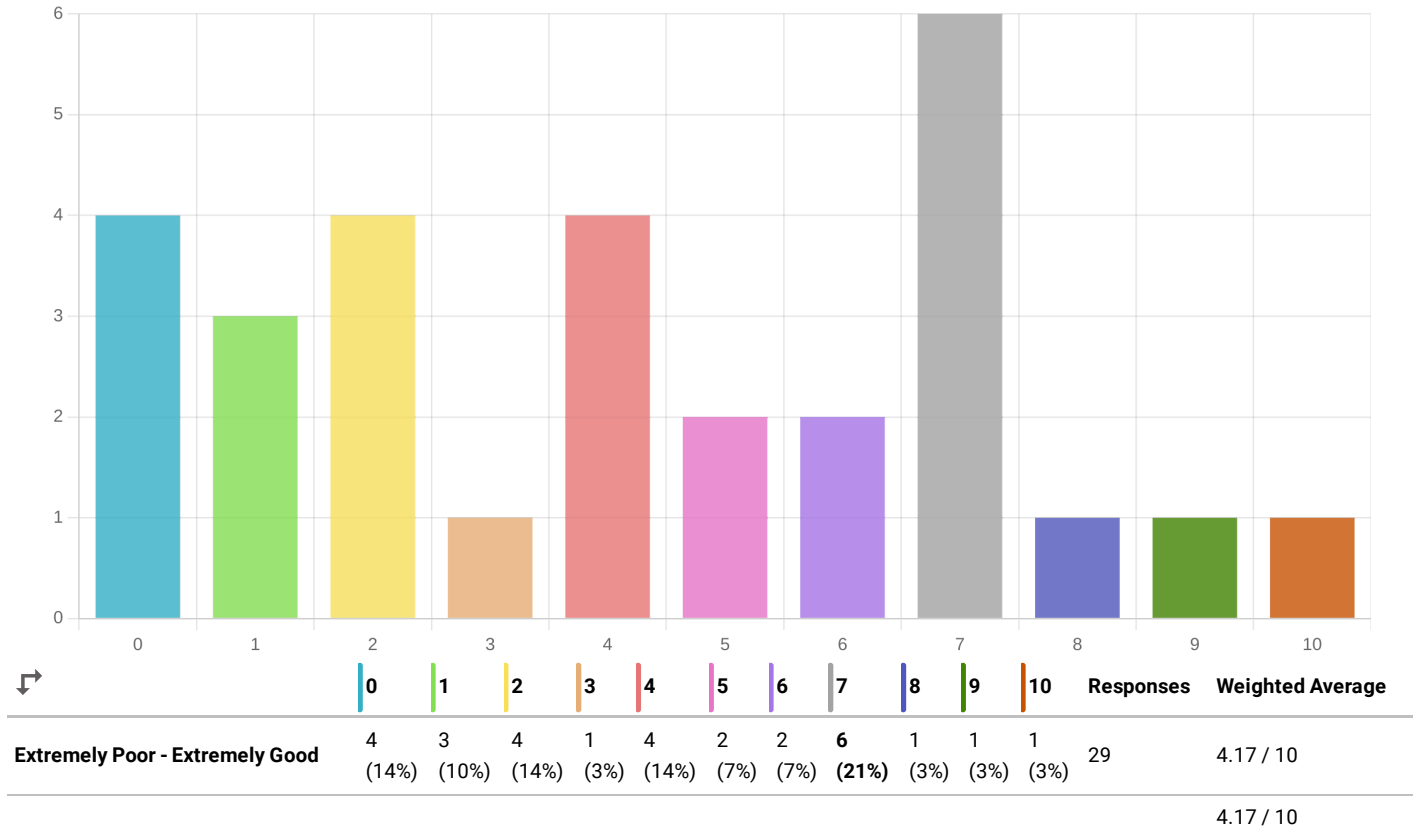
Opened a new club in 2015 called South East Boxing club in a deprived area with now other boxing or sport club in the area. Have taken on some special needs people also over the years. Have achieved success at home and abroad with boxers. Trained several coaches who have come up through the ranks from boxers. I am county secretary, qualified coach judge and referee.

We have kept our club going during the pandemic and remain open. Our boxers have taken part in national competitions, our coaches have attended fundamentals in boxing course as well as judging course. 8 Do you have a clear picture of the role of a Board of Directors in a company?



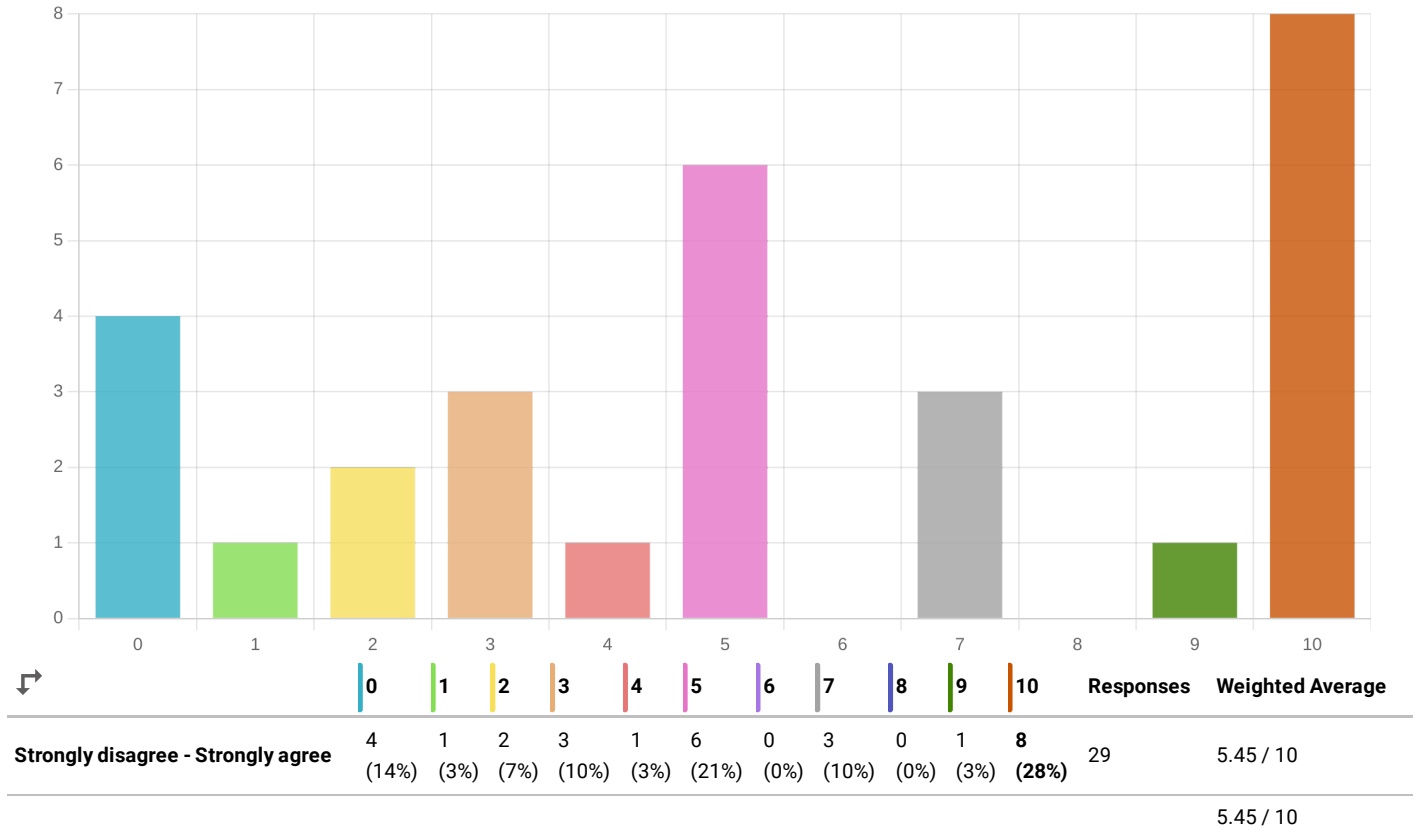
11 Please rate the Board of Directors' reform and development of IABA over the last 12 months



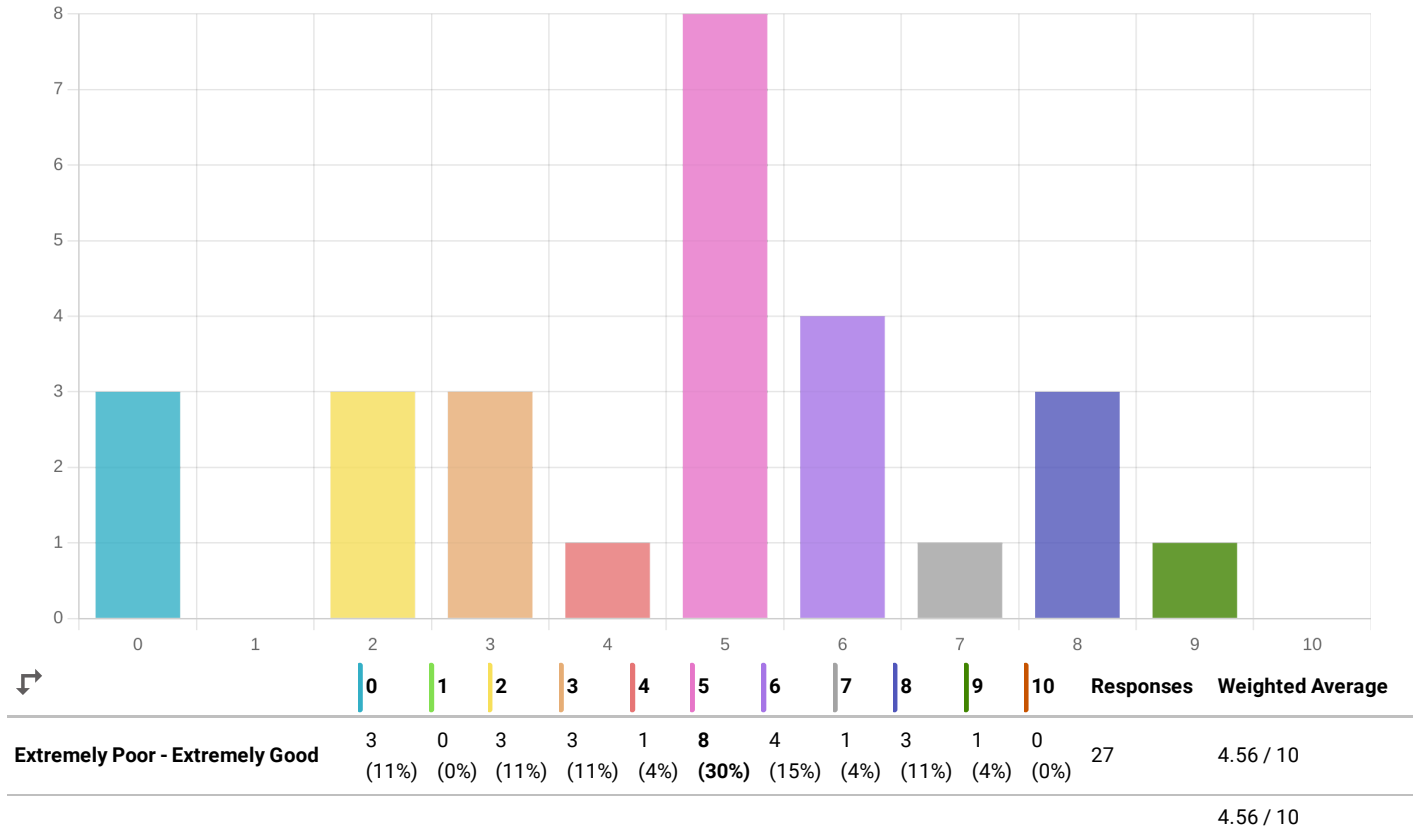

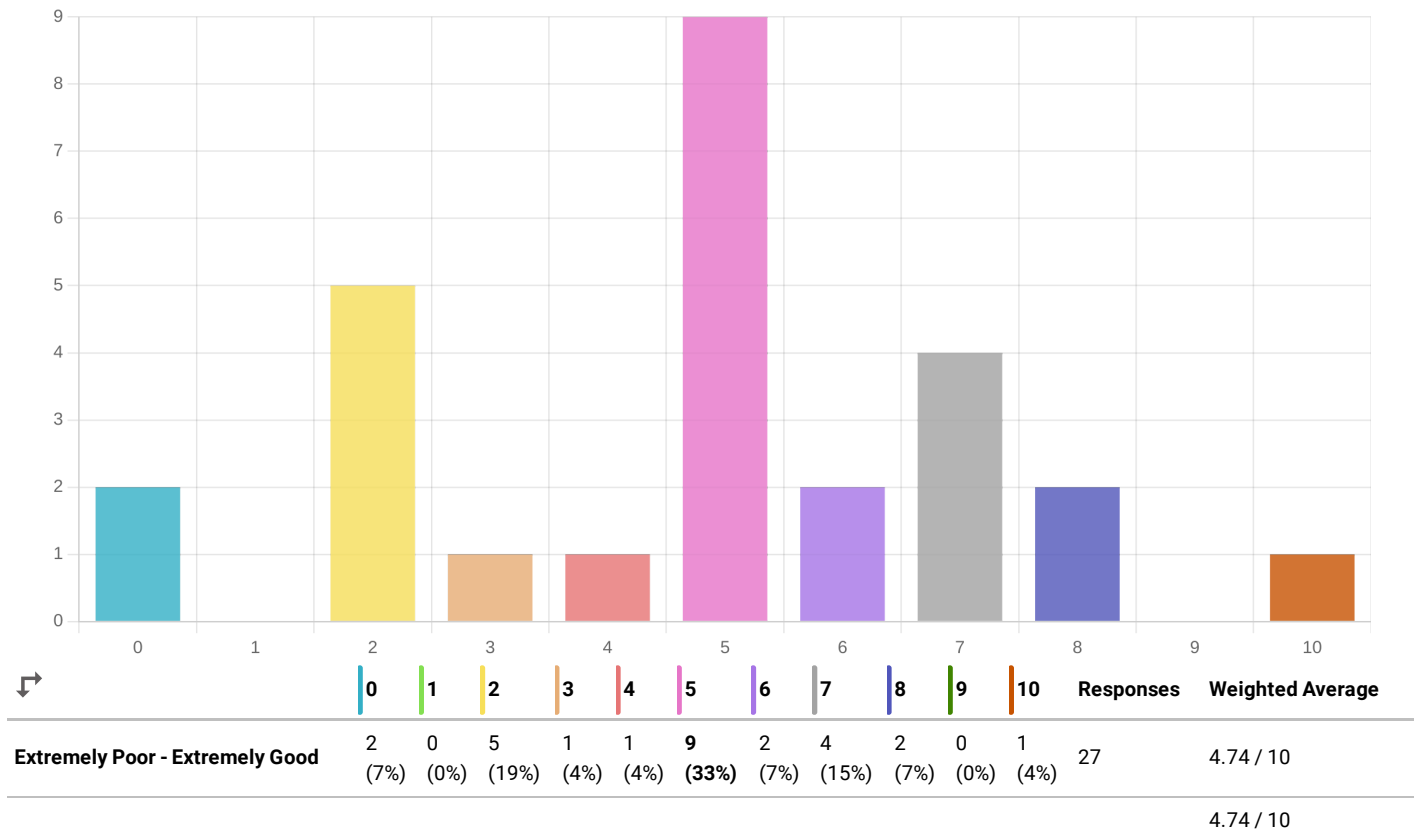
13 To what extent do you agree or disagree that the composition of the Board should remain 70% membership and 30% independent?



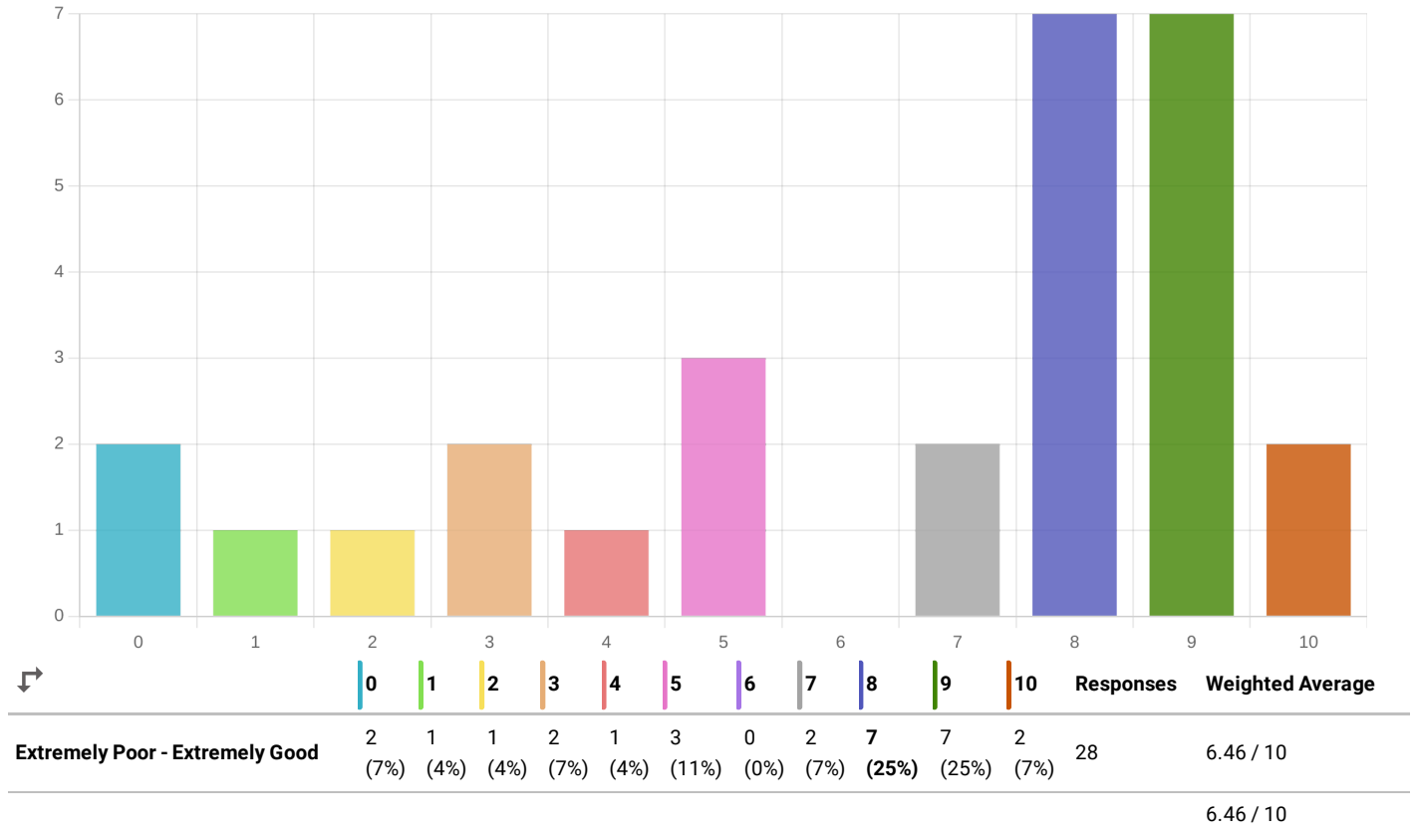
15 Over the last 12 months, Central Council, please rate the performance and effectiveness of the IABA's Central Council



19 Please rate Central Council's operation of National Championships, fielding of international teams t Youth, Junior and Schools, and organisation of events such as squad training in the last 12 months



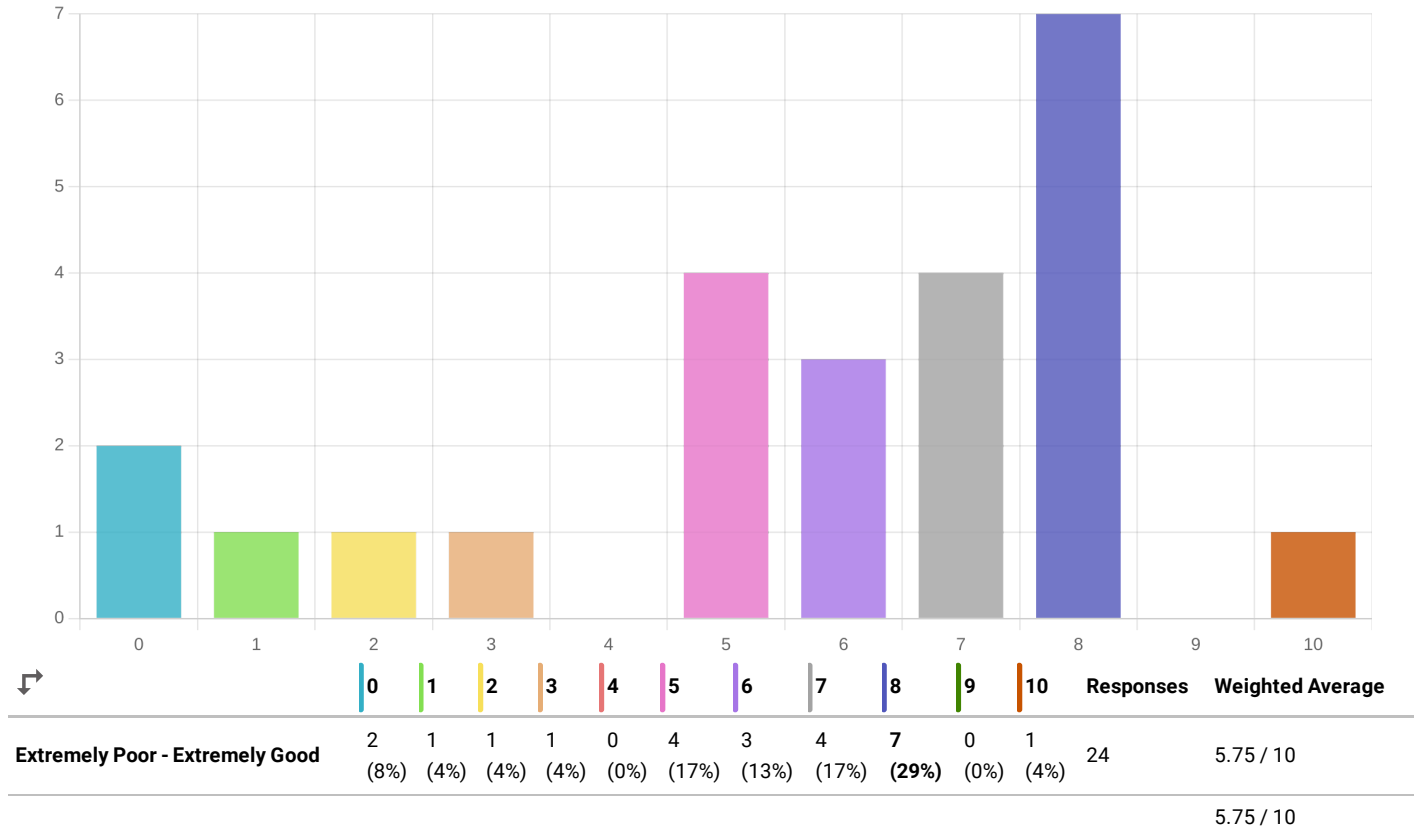
20 Over the last 12 months, please rate the performance and effectiveness of the your provincial council or unit



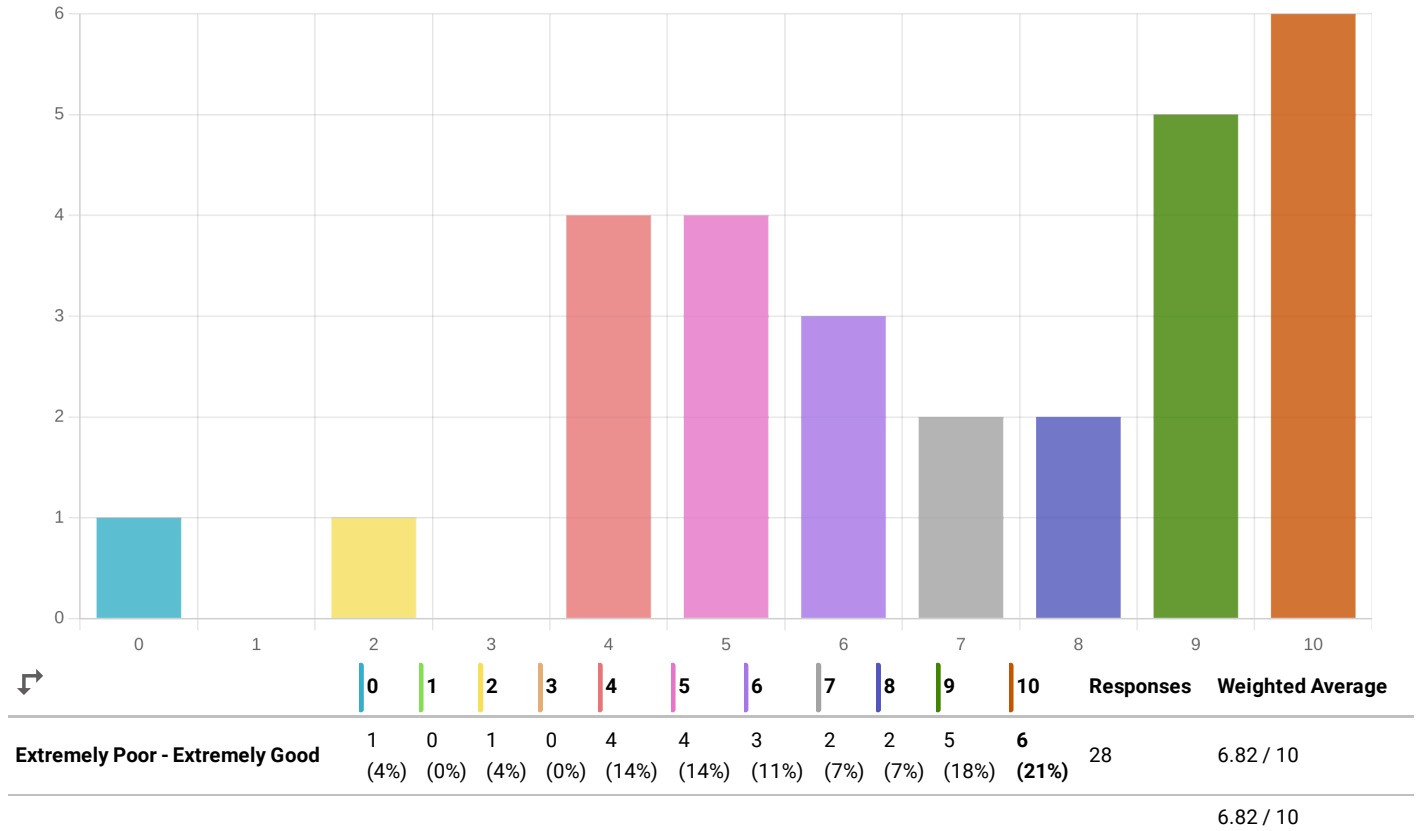

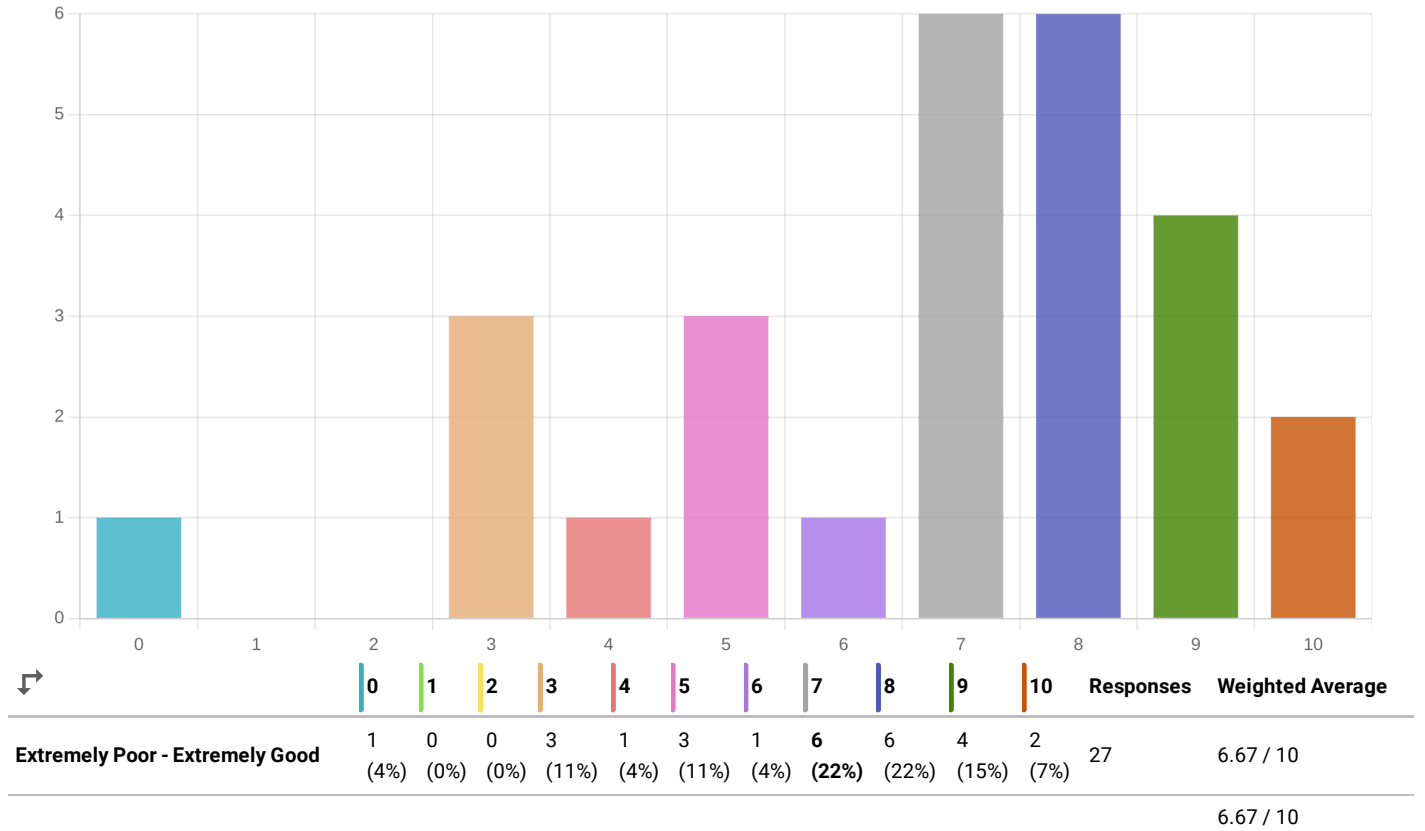
24 Please rate your provincial council or unit operation of competitions, organisation of squad training and fielding of teams in the last 12 months



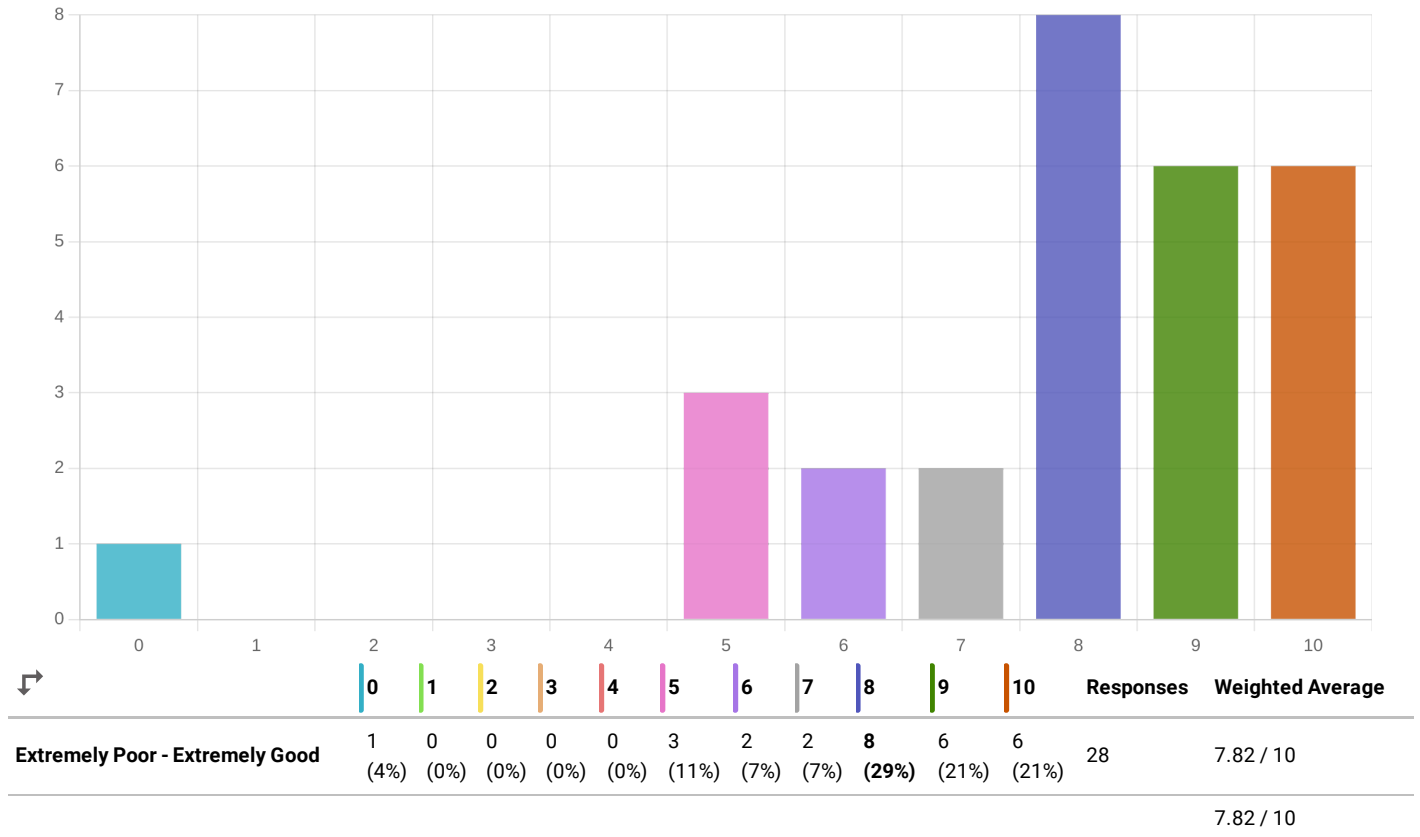
25 Over the last 12 months, please rate the performance and effectiveness of the IABA's High Performance Unit



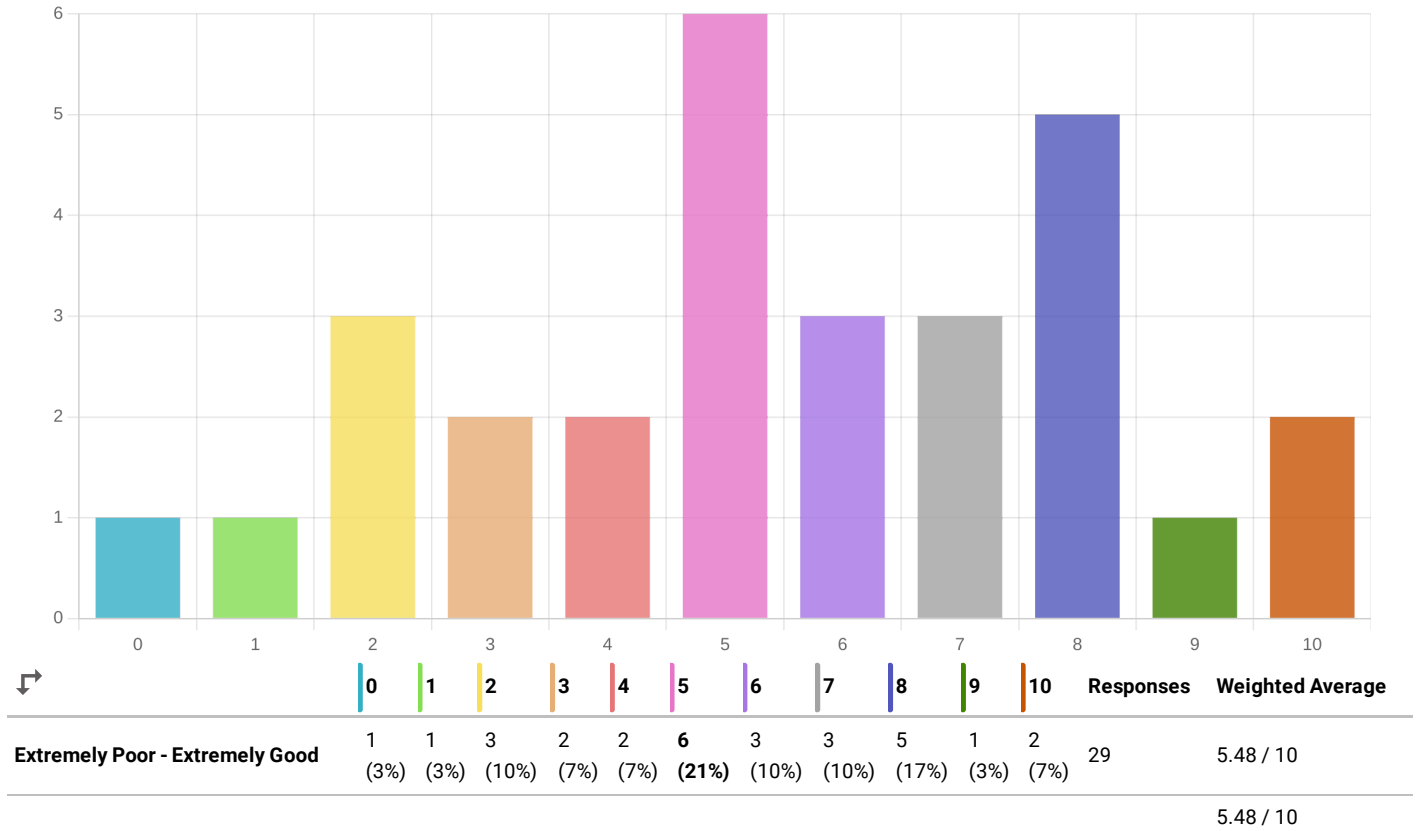
29 Please rate your perception of the High Performance Unit's fielding of international teams, and holding of events such as multi-nations camps over the last 12 months



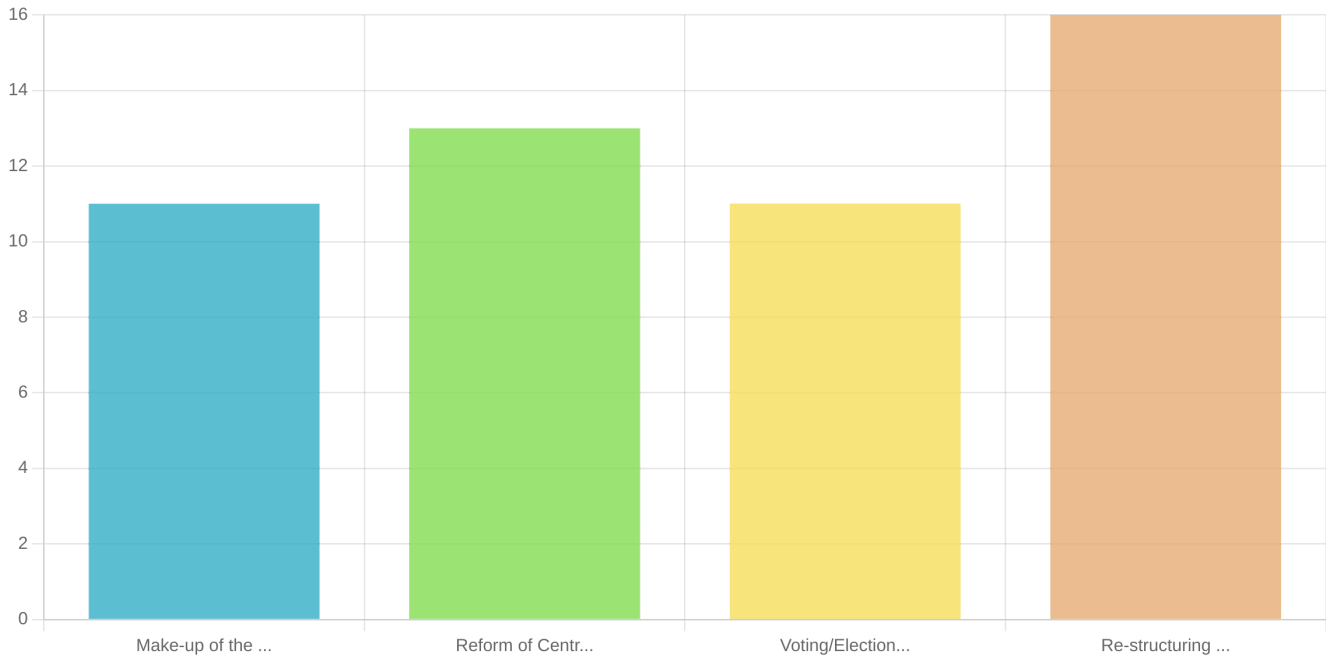
30 Over the last 12 months, please rate the effectiveness of IABA staff members

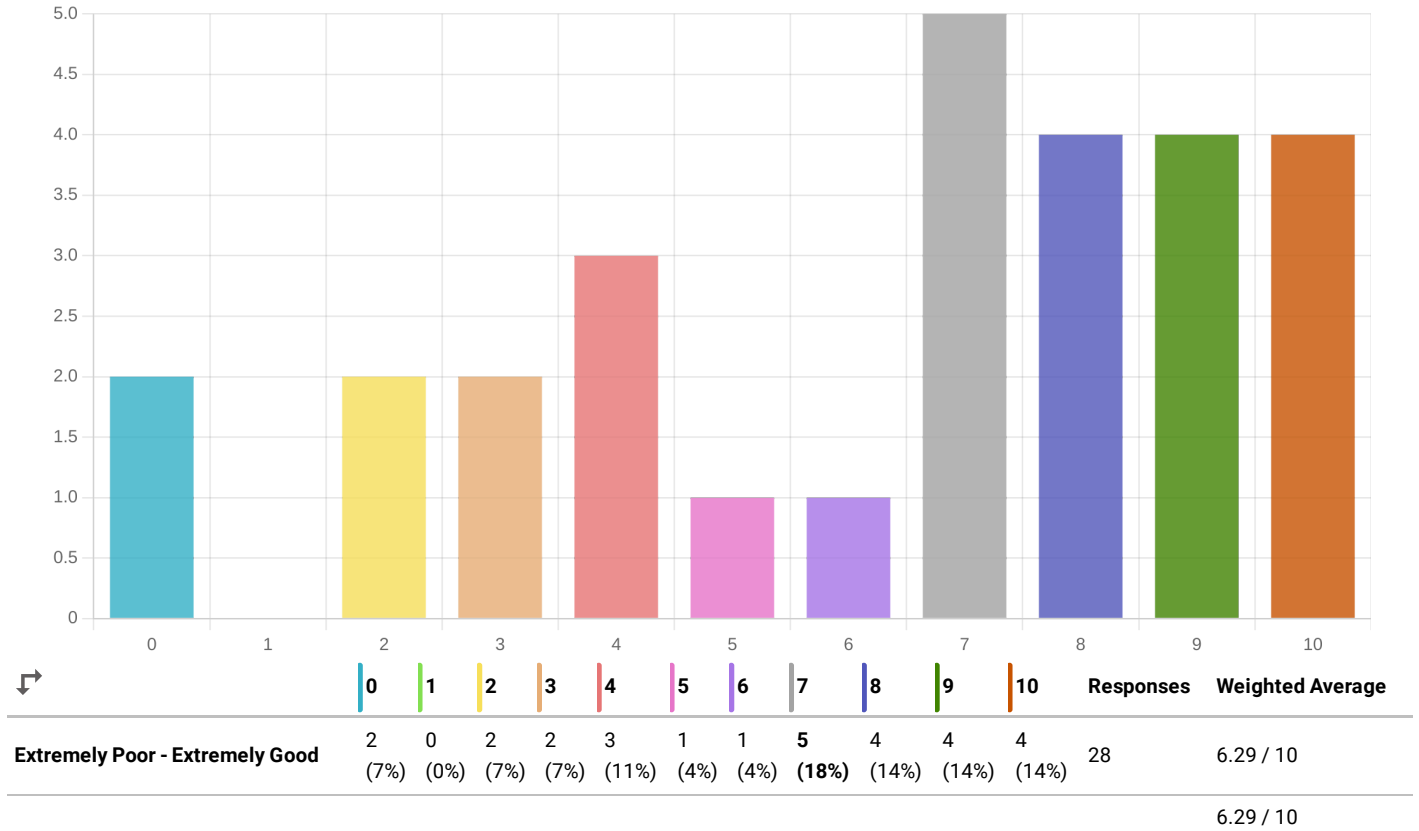

I find myself increasingly sad for our top talented boxers. They are not being given the opportunities to develop or compete that boxers from other nations take for granted.

Probably been worst year I have witnessed in my history of IABA - president should not of lasted a week. Picking of under 22 team a joke - been push over by SI, not standing up to them - FAI - GAA or Rugby don't put up their shit why should we. We have good paid personnel but they are not used properly - too many bloody survey like this - look when you have young boxers coming up for squad training on Saturdays and are sent on a run then a bag sessions lol with no proper programme in place - HP under 22 team picked on champions for 7 months previous no one knows if they are even training - a school boxer sent European's 3kg over weight. After all it's boxing if these things are not got right you will not grow boxing it's that simple no work been put into finding the next Olympic champion

Yes our female 14 Year old boxer went to win cadets a couple of months ago and was told that if we got in to the world championship that she would be going she's a great 57kg boxer who beat 3 Irish champions and trained with the high performance team for months and then wasn't picked for the team that is going guaranteed she'd bring home a medal but never got a chance probably one of the best female boxers in the country and will probably give it up know never mind all the costs of the last couple of months it an absolute disgrace

This year's youth world championship boxers were not pick on merit they were pick on people agendas

The IABA is pushing for gender equality, start promoting womens boxing we've had two olympic gold medals with women and the IABA has failed miserably to promote womens boxing, the iaba should of paid katie or kellie to visit every club in the country by now and promote the sport. Boxing is prevalent in all 32 counties, with talent (coaches/boxers) everywhere. But the focus seems to be on a select few HP boxers who have been lucky enough to win championships. There is a lack of consideration for the regions, and this is to the detriment of our sport.

Keep past champions in the sport. Look at Emmet Brennan and Jason Moore they coach fundamentals in their business 'FightR'. Use that model with the small colleges around Dublin and create a club start up program course, teach them in the models coaching basics, social media training, affiliation and business, first aid and include level 1 IABA boxing coach cert in it. Also get IABATV channel up and running again

Women are statistical the most successful boxers we have and they get the least support they are under represented on the committees, officials and through the sport in general
